Place all your recyclable materials in a Macomb recycling bin, and place at the curb on your regular day of collection.



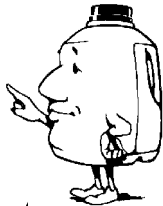
The Can-do list





Recycle any aluminum cans, tin cans or bi-metal cans that contained food or beverages. Labels do not have to be removed.

Plastic Picks

Two types of plastics are recyclable. Look for the following symbols on BOTTLES.



 PET -- soda type BOTTLES.

 HDPE -- Milk or water jugs, detergent BOTTLES.

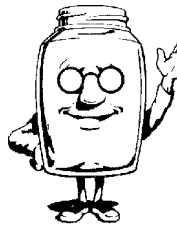
Remove all caps from containers. No styrofoam, plastic salad/fruit containers, plastic plates or black microwave trays.



Paper, paper & more paper

Newspaper, envelopes, copy paper, magazines, junk mail, and manila folders are acceptable. Paper products may be placed in grocery bags, paper or plastic.

Macomb Recycling continues 




Don't Pass the Glass

Recycle clear, green or brown unbroken glass jars, bottles and jugs that contained food or beverages. No windows, auto glass, or dishes. Labels do not have to be removed.

Your cardboard collection

Only corrugated cardboard is accepted. Flatten and bundle boxes and place at the curb near the recycling bin. NO chipboard such as; beer and soda boxes, or wax coated milk or juice cartons.

Remember

-  Place only recyclable items in the recycling bin...no garbage or other trash.
-  Remove lids from plastic, glass and metal containers.
-  Rinse all containers.
-  Labels do not have to be removed.
-  Items left in the bin after collection are not recyclable.

Note: Markets for recyclable materials are constantly changing. The actual recycling and reuse of items included in the Macomb program is dependent on market demand.
